Proposed Cllr K Wakeham. Seconded Cllr S Smith. All agreed.</p> <p>4) 23860 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION The clerk was requested to send letters to residents regarding complaints made relating to vegetation obstructing the 30mph speed limit sign at the South end of the village and overhanging trees along the pedestrian path by the Surgery. It was also noted that the area in and around the Shute required weeding.</p> <p>5) 23861 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR Cllr Pugh reported that no further action had been taken relating to issues at Greystone Pool as law courts are still not sitting. Physical meetings at County Hall are not expected to resume before May 2021. Cllr Wakeham requested photographs taken at Budley Water, showing excessive water running under the bridge, are shown to Highways. Cllr Pugh replied that he will contact Highways again but many areas had experienced similar problems during the heavy rainfall of the past few days. Cllr J R Philp reported that Highways had still not collected road signs that had been left on the highway six months previously, Cllr Pugh will follow this up. Cllr Puckey enquired why several large concrete slabs, that had been in a tributary of the River Pol since February, had not been removed even though the Environment Agency had full knowledge of the issue and had visited the site on several occasions. Cllr Pugh will make enquiries with the Environment Agency.</p> <p>6) 23862 SENTRY MEADOW Cllr Wakeham reported that the site visit attended by Cllr Beall and himself proved interesting and informative. Both felt the new development offered spacious accommodation to a good standard and the development was well laid out. 7) 23863 CASUAL VACANCIES

The clerk stated that the Monitoring Officer has been advised of two resignations from the Council, Eric Gibbs and Paul Evans. The notice of casual vacancy will be displayed dated 1st September 2020.

8) 23864 DEFIBRILLATOR

After discussion and guidance on the best option from Cllr Smith it was resolved to purchase the replacement defibrillator from SWAST for £1800 plus VAT.

The clerk will apply for £400 grant funding from Cllr Pugh's Community Chest Fund towards the cost of the defibrillator.

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9) 23865 BURIAL GROUND

The clerk stated that Cornwall Council has confirmed that the closed churchyard is scheduled to be cut within the next ten days. It was resolved to make a decision after this cut whether additional work was required by Mr J Welch to tidy the area.

10) 23866 HEDGE

Hedge on the grass verge adjacent to the B3359 - It was resolved to write a letter to the resident in Barton Meadow stating that the Parish Council should be contacted for advice before any further hedge cutting is undertaken.

Dog fouling notices had been delivered by the dog warden including two metal signs. It was also noted that Government Grant Funding for the Village Hall had been applied for and received. The Village Hall will be used by the Surgery during September to hold flu clinics.
