

not have the power to enforce removal of vehicles parking on junctions. Cllr Hannaford introduced herself to the meeting and stated that she was attending as a member of the public to establish areas of importance to the Parish.

PC Brailey-Evans left the meeting at 7.47pm.

6) 23942 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR

Cllr Pugh stated that the public must be made aware that parking issues at Luffman Close have been discussed at Parish Council meetings on numerous occasions. He said members had decided not to pursue the idea of a hard surface for the grassed area as residents were already parking there and the financial outlay to undertake the work was deemed to be excessive. Cllr Wakeham suggested that members should visit the area again before the next meeting to ascertain if the problem is exacerbated at certain times of the day. He also suggested that the problem has increased dramatically due to residents having more than one car per household whereas in previous years this was not the case. It was noted that Cornwall Council has applied a 5% increase to the council tax. Cllr Pugh also enquired if there are any roads in the parish being left untreated in icy conditions as Cornwall Councillors are meeting to discuss possible updates to the road treatment schedule, Luffman Close and Richmond Road were suggested as possible additions. A new project called Looe Valley Trails is in the early stages to provide cycle and walking trails, Cllr Pugh will send the press release to Cllr Wright for inclusion in the Eye on Pelynt. Cllr Pugh stated that after further discussion with Highways it had been confirmed that the speed limit signs at Sentry Meadow would not be changed until the development road had been adopted by Cornwall Council.

Cllr S Smith rejoined the meeting at 7.57pm.

7) 23943 SENTRY MEADOW

- a) Burial Ground Land Transfer Agreement – It was resolved to ratify the decision made prior to the meeting accepting changes to the agreement made by Coastline Housing.

Proposed Cllr J R Philp. Seconded Cllr A Taylor. All agreed.

- b) Car Parking Management Strategy – It was agreed that the Management Strategy was ambiguous and required further clarification on management responsibility relating to the Informal Open Space Area. It was resolved to return the Management Strategy detailing the changes required including a request for lockable drop down bollards in place of the lockable chain arrangement relating to the allocated car parking spaces for the memorial garden.

8) 23944 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Cllr Wright and Cllr Mattick are engaging with the eight volunteers to establish strengths and interests. Zoom meetings will be held via a shared licence with the Parish Council. Cllr Pugh and Cllr Hannaford had both been helpful sharing useful advice and contacts. Issues with data protection and insurance for the sub-committee will be investigated.

9) 23945 FLOWER/BULB PLANTING ON VERGES

It was suggested that any residents wanting to be involved with flower and bulb planting in the village should in the first instance approach the Parish Council with a plan and costing for the project. Cllr Wakeham will post this suggestion on Facebook where the idea was originally raised.
